Program Overview

The Floodplains Reimagined Program is a financial incentive program for willing landowners exploring the feasibility and benefits of a winter-time inundation for ecosystem health. From August 2021 – July 2023, RD 108 is managing Phase I with State and Federal funding.


What to Expect

- Virtual and in-person meetings in the region
- Available water and financial data and materials to inform landowner consideration of participation
- Solicitation of landowner activities to support winter time inundation objectives
- Solicitation of landowner input to influence the development of technical assistance and financial incentive programs
- Development of potential subregional project portfolio

Vision

To improve floodplain connectivity for multiple purposes through voluntary collaborative partnerships with private landowners, sovereign tribal entities, government, and non-government representatives.
